General Information for Weekenders

All Weekenders must report to 200 James Robertson Parkway Nashville, Tennessee 37201 (3rd Avenue Warrants Entrance, Lobby Door near Gay Street).

REPORT TIMES ARE 7 DAYS A WEEK

Medical Information: the medical staff maintains a large supply of many commonly used prescription medication on site for inmates. It is required for each person reporting **to bring a list of currently prescribed medications (filled within the last 90 days**) from your pharmacy and/or provider with you upon arrival. Subsequently, no outside medications will be accepted. Inmates with unique medical problems such as treatment with special medication (injectable or anti-rejection medication, assisted detox medication, etc.) should contact DCSO medical at (615) 862-8152 or Fax medical information to (615) 252-8005. All medication will be verified.

What you need to bring with you:

- <u>Medication that has been pre-approved per DCSO Medical.</u> Must be in the original bottle, label with your name (intact) and filled in the last 90 days. All medication WILL BE VERIFIED.
- If you would like to make phone calls during your stay, during the intake /dress out process, you can deposit a small amount of cash (Kiosk in dress out area) to your commissary account in order to purchase phone time in your housing location. All unused funds will be placed on a debit card and given to you upon release.
- NO OTHER ITEMS ARE ALLOWED

***You will be provided with the following:

- 1 wash cloth
- 1 towel
- 1 pair of shower shoes
- 1 pair of socks
- 1 T-Shirt
- 1 bra (for women)
- 1 Panty (for women)
- 1 boxer
- 1 Tumbler

1 hygiene package (toothbrush, toothpaste and soap)

It is also a violation of facility and program rules for you report under the influence of drugs and alcohol. Offenders reporting under the influence will be reported to your presiding Judge. You are expected to follow the Housing Rules while you are incarcerated. Offenders failing to follow the rules will receive disciplinary actions. Offenders caught smuggling contraband will be criminally charged. No private vehicles allowed on correctional property.
